I leave my Granddaughter Martha Boswell Glenn in Bed one under Bed 1 Pz of Blanks 1 Pz New Sheets 1 Pz Pillow Cases 1 quilt the Calico one or the White one which ever she chooses the other for dear little Fannie. I also leave my granddaughter Martha B Glenn my new Beaucraft sofa the Rocking Chair or the Settum Chair the other for Fannie Ellen I also leave Martha B Glenn my new Bed sheet & curtains and one half of all my little effects. I leave my granddaughter Fannie Ellen Glenn one Bed one under bed, one pr Blanks, one pr New Sheets, one pr Pillow cases the red draping table and my looking glass that stays up stairs and the other half of my effects. I also leave my granddaughter Fannie Ellen Glenn one hundred dollars for the sole purpose of sending her to school & nothing else. I also wish Mr Fauntley to have the care of it for that purpose I leave my grandson James Roy Glenn one Bed one under bed one pr New Sheets one pr Blanks one pr Pillow Cases and the Blue calico spread. I leave my grandson Peter Matt Glenn my dining table and my grandson George Garrison Glenn my tea table. I leave my son Thomas Macken Boswell Roy fifty Acres of land. I leave my grandson Churchill Boswell Roy fifty Acres of land. I also leave my grandson Thomas Monday Roy fifty Acres of land. I leave my grandson Macken Boswell Roy fifty Acres of land or leave my son Thomas Macken Boswell Roy my gold watch. As witness my hand and seal this ninth day of May 1858

At a Court held for the County of Madison at the Court house there of at
Saluda on Wednesday the 22nd day of June 1864. This writing purporting to be
the last will and testament of Martha B. Ray etc was produced in Court
and there being no subscribing witness Thos Richard Mc Glenn Alfred Kealy
John J. Maston and John A. Geddes were sworn and severally deposed that
they are well acquainted with the testators hand writing and truly believe the
said writing and the name Thos Richard subscribed to be wholly written by the
testator our hand whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as
the true last will and testament of the said Martha B. Ray
