

Randall Brown: In the name of God. Amen. I Randall Brown of Gloucester County,
Virginia do make this my last will and testament, as follows, that is to say,
My desire is to be buried with as little expence as decency will permit,
and that all my debts and funeral expences, be paid as soon after my
decease as conveniently may be.

Item first: I give and devise to my son John R. Brown three
Acres of land, commencing on the road, and and, running per-
allel with the land he now owns, - the whole length of my land -

Item second. I give and devise to my Grand Daughter Mollie Brown,
two acres of land, upon which the house I now live in stands. my
intention is that the two acres of land shall go with the house and
include the yard.

Item third I give and devise all the rest of my land to my children,
Sam Brown, Nannie Purnell Mary Brown, and Judy Brown to be
Equally divided among them.

Item fourth. I give and bequeath all my personal effects, to Ambrose
Scott and my son John R. Brown after having paid all my just
debts out of said personal property.

Item fifth. I nominate and appoint James L. Taliaferro, my executor;
of this my last will and testament, and ask the Court not to require
any security of him.
