In the name of God Amen. I Samuel Divers of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia do hereby make this my last will and Testament to say, After the payment of my funeral expenses I leave all of my property both real and personal to my wife Julia Ann Divers as long as she may live and after her death I devise the same as follows.

To my friend Signera Harrison in return for her kindness and services to me I bequeath all of the personal property that may remain in possession of my wife Julia Ann at the time of her death, and to the said Signera Harrison in further consideration of her kindness and services to me. I devise to her five acres of land two acres of which is that part or parcel of land on which Cupid Parice now lives and three acres to be taken from the balance of my land adjoining the said two acres upon which Cupid Parice now lives, said five acres is to be that part or parcel of land on which my dwelling house now stands -

After the death of my wife I devise the balance of my real estate containing eight and one half acres more or less to my Friend Thomas C. Walker in consideration of his kindness to me and the further consideration of sixty five dollars to be paid by the said Thomas C. Walker to my creditors should my debts amount to that much and if not that much the said Thomas C. Walker pay off all of my debts and pay the burial & funeral expenses of my wife Julia Ann Divers. In case the said Thomas C. Walker makes default in discharging the debts now owed by me to my creditors, the said tract of land containing eight and one half acres is to be subject to the payment of the notes now held against me by my creditors at the death of my wife Julia Ann Divers. And I nominate and appoint Thomas Walker ex. executor of this my last will and Testament.
