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In the name of God. I Seth Pointer of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia being of a sound mind do make this my last will. I desire all my just debts to be paid having by deed conveyed to my children my land but which in no way deprived my Dearly beloved Wife of her interest. I desire in token of my affection to give her for her life ^{all} of my personal estate. Consisting of household and kitchen furniture. Carriages harness Stock of horses cows sheep hogs and bonds and accounts. all moneys I may die possessed of excepting enough to pay the small legacies I may hereafter leave. I desire that my administrators give to Mr McHardwood infant son of John A. McHardwood one hundred Dollars when he arrives at the age of 21 years old as a token of my friend ship. After the death of my Wife I desire all

my personal estate to be equally divided between my children or their heirs in the following manner, one half to my son Samuel D. Pointer, and the other half to Samuel D. Pointer Trustee of my daughter Lucy V. Pointer to be held by him in trust for the benefit of her and her children.

Finally I appoint Samuel D. Pointer and my son in law James A. Leavitt my administrators and desire that they be allowed to administer on my estate without giving security for the same. In witness whereof I have this 7th day of February 1870 affixed my hand and seal.
