I SUSAN ENOS of the County of Gloucester in the State of Virginia being  
of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make and declare this  
my last will and testament:

1<sup>st</sup> I lend to my grand daughter Susan Stubblefield one equal fifth part of  
my land for and during her natural life and at her death I give the same  
to such child or children of my said grand daughter as she may leave at  
her death.

2. I wish and do hereby direct that the balance of my land after deducting the  
fifth part lent to my said grand daughter to be sold by my Executor herein after  
named on such terms as he may think most beneficial, and the money arising  
from such sale to be lent out upon good security -

3. I give to my daughter in law Catherine Enos for her support during her

natural life all interest accruing on all money due me and on the money arising from the sale of the land.

3. I wish my slaves and all other property not herein otherwise disposed of to be divided into five equal parts; one fifth of which I lend to my said grand daughter Susan Stubblefield for and during her natural life for her sole and exclusive benefit and use and free from all control or liability to the debts, of her husband James B. Stubblefield; and at her death I give the same to such child or children as she may leave.

I lend to my three grand daughters Mary Frances Minor, Martha Ann Enos and Joannah Enos for and during their natural lives, three fifths of my property referred to in the third clause of this my will to be held and enjoyed by them for their sole and exclusive use and benefit free from the control or liability to the debts of the husbands of the said Mary Frances Minor, Martha Ann Enos and Joannah Enos and at their respective deaths I give their several and respective portions of my estate to such child or children as they may severally leave, and if either of my said grand daughters shall die without lawful issue of her body I give and bequeath her portion of the property herein lent her to my surviving grand children for life subject to the limitations herein annexed to their respective estates with remainder to their children.

The remaining fifth part of my estate I give and bequeath to my grand son Thomas Leary Enos and his heirs forever.

At the death of my daughter in law Catherine Enos I wish the money arising from the sale of my land to be divided into four equal parts, one fourth part whereof I lend to each of my said grand daughters Mary Frances Minor, Martha Ann Enos and Joannah Enos for and during their natural lives for their sole and exclusive use and benefit free from all control and liability to the debts of their husbands and at their deaths I give their respective portions three-

of I lend to each of my said grand daughters Mary Frances Minor, Martha Ann Enos and Joannah Enos for and during their natural lives for their sole and exclusive use and benefit free from all control and liability to the debts of their husbands and at their deaths I give their respective portions thereof to such child or children as they may leave, And the remaining fourth part I give to my grand son Thomas Cary Enos to him and his heirs forever.

At the death of my daughter in law Catherine Enos I wish the balance of the money referred to in the 3<sup>rd</sup> clause hereof other than that arising from the sale of the land divided into five equal parts, one fifth part thereof I lend to each of my grand daughters Susan Stubbfield, Mary Frances Minor, Martha Ann Enos and Joannah Enos for and during their natural lives for their sole and separate use and benefit free from the control or liability to the debts of their husbands and at their respective deaths I give their respective portions thereof to such child or children as they may leave, And the remaining fifth part I give to my grand son Thomas Cary Enos to him and his heirs forever.
