Will of
Temple G. Catlett

I Temple G. Catlett of Worcester County, being in pretty good health and sound mind and memory and having made a preparation to meet death and knowing the uncertainty of life, I do now make this my last will and testament. I give my soul to God, who gave it me in hopes of a blissful immortality and eternal life.

- 1st I wish and desire all my debts paid as soon as it may be practicable.
- 2nd I lend to my wife Martha S. Catlett all my estate real and personal as long as she remains my widow, and in the event of her marriage it is my wish that an equal division be made as hereafter directed except Ada. I wish her educated out of my estate for that purpose she is to receive one and above the rest. It is further my wish that all my children, be supported out of my estate as long as they remain single, and in the event that one or more of my children get married, I wish my wife to give a land a portion of my estate, to which they may be entitled, which must be charged to them as so much of their interest as they may be entitled in a final division, so that an equal distribution may be made, this at the discretion of my wife.
- 3rd At the death of my wife, it is my wish, that all the property real and personal then belonging to my estate be equally divided amongst my three children, tho' if Catlett Mary S. Catlett and Ada S. Catlett except so much thereof as may be necessary to complete Ada's education (unless she shall have received her education) which she is to receive that much over and above, Thomas and Mary, and thus have an equal share.

Lastly I wish my wife Martha S. Catlett and my son Thomas to qualify as Executors and
