In the name of God amen, I Thomas Booth Fox of Violet Bank  
in the County of Gloucester Gentleman do dispose of the temporal goods  
which it has pleased God to give me recommending first my soul  
into the merciful hands of God and my Saviour Jesus Christ desir-  
ing that I may be buried on my own plantation nearest my dearest  
mother I do by these presents revoke all Testaments and Wills before by  
me made it being my desire that this be my last Will and Testa-  
ment disposing thus knew I declare that I have named and ap-  
pointed my most beloved son Thomas Booth Fox John Bayler Fox  
William B. Fox George D. Fox and my beloved and dearest daughters  
Frances Ann and Elizabeth D. Fox my sole and universal heirs  
of all my estate both real and personal which I shall leave at the  
day of my death I lend to my beloved son Thomas Booth Fox  
the estate I now live on during his natural life Should he  
die without heirs then I give it to my son William B. Fox to  
him and his heirs forever but it is my will and desire that

should my said son Thomas Booth have a son that he may have the said estate (that is to say his eldest) but if no son to go to his eldest daughter I intend the whole estate to be so disposed of Commonly Called Violet Bank Containing about one thousand acres more or less I further desire my son William may have a double proportion of my negroes, that is to say twice the number that my son Thomas B. Fox has & John B. Fox has & that my son George & Elizabeth divide in the same manner having double shares they not having half the property of the others namely Thomas John & Frances Ann I desire that Courtney Baylor Fox my wife have one third part of all my estate with such carriage horses as I do possess of I furthermore desire that all money or debts due me at the time of my death particularly a legacy left me by my wife's Father Six hundred pounds & interest with all other dues whatsoever after the payment of my debts may be equally divided between my children William, George, & Elizabeth applying the interest to their education I append, There is some place my dear mother left my son Thomas B. Fox which I desire may be taken care of by my executors for him as Orphans are too often defrauded & injured from neglect a reference to her will will describe the sort & quantity I also order & desire an appraisement of my estate not wishing the inquisitive curiosity of the vulgar gratified by an examination of my effects I desire Henry who now lives on a part of my land at my mill may be provided with a house on a part of my land and supported as heretofore with meat bread & cloathing but to continue on the mill tract so long as I hold it; Should I die possessed of the mill and land adjoining I then give it to my son William B. Fox to him this bears power. I give Frances Ann (my

I die possessed of the mill and land adjoining I then give it to my son  
William B. Fox to him this heirs forever. I give Frances Ann (my  
eldest daughter) the following negroes to wit Violet Winneys daughter with  
all her children & all her future increase, Catherine & Mary & to all their increase  
to her & her heirs forever also Hannah daughter Leah. I desire my Son Thomas  
B. Fox may have my boy George Maiakis son over & above his proportion of  
negroes & that he may, he may have Leroy in his part. I desire my son  
William have Violet's son Tom in his part & that my son George have  
Frances son Bob in his part - I furthermore desire should my dear  
daughter Frances Ann Fox die leaving no issue then & in that case I  
desire the negroes given her may be equally divided between my three  
youngest children & in like manner should any of the rest die I  
do desire their parts to be divided amongst the Young Survivors  
except the lands -

Should it so please the disposer of events that all die I then desire  
it may be divided amongst the Children of George D. Baylor by my wife  
& a part to John P. Whiting & his brothers Francis & William giving my  
brother William Fox's children one hundred pounds each & that William &  
Emanuel Jones may be equal Shearers. But in no event a contingency  
whatever shall John W. Fox Son of any brother John Fox or another John  
Fox said to be Henry Fox's Son have any part share proportion of my  
estate. I furthermore charge my estate with one hundred dollars & In-  
terest from 1814 for the purpose of getting three Tombstones as mentioned in  
my another will which I request my executors to get as soon as convenient  
I appoint Doct William Tuliaferro my executor

 the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April 1825. This last will and Testament of Thomas  
 B Fox was produced in Court for proof and there being no witness-  
 es to it, Richard Jones, John Lewis and Thomas C Arnory were sworn  
 and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the hand  
 writing of the Testator and verily believe the said will and the name  
 thereunto subscribed are all in the proper hand writing of the said  
 Testator whereupon the said will was ordered to be recorded and is re-  
 corded
