First It is my wish and desire that my beloved wife Mary Kille shall continue to keep house and to keep every thing together except what is herein after provided and with the assistance of my children to cultivate the farm as long as she may continue my widow and no longer for their general support.

Secondly It is my wish and desire that so soon after my decease as may be covenanted that my Executor herein after named shall sell and dispose of all my personal property at public Auction that can be conveniently spared from the farm and out of the moneys arising therefrom and any moneys that may come into his hands from the collection of any claims due me to pay all my funeral expenses and all my just and lawfull debts.

Thirdly It is my wish and desire and I direct my executor herein after named that in event of my wife Mary Kille marrying again then and in that case or at her death as my widow to sell the same out of my personal property at public Auction and out of the proceeds thereof or any money that may be in his hands to pay to my wife Mary Kille provided however she marry the sum of thirty dollars annually for her own absolute use and benefit as long as she may live.

Fourthly I direct my executor herein after named at the death of

Fourthly I direct my executor hereinafter named at the death of my wife Mary Kilever in event of her marriage to have my real estate divided into as many shares as I may have children then living and the said shares equally allotted to my children and the said shares or parcel of land so allotted I lend to my children as long as they may live and at their death I give and bequeath the said land to their lawfull heirs.

And I hereby constitute and appoint my friend M. B. Sewell executor of this my last will and testament.
