1st I wish and direct my executor hereinafter named to pay all my just debts which may be due by me at the time of my death.

2nd I give and devise to my son John R. Marchant of Middlesex County Va the farm on which I now reside. Containing about 600 acres and called and known as South side, and also I give and bequeath to my said son John R. Marchant all my personal estate of every kind and description consisting of house hold and kitchen furniture, farming implements, stock money and bonds and notes due me

3rd I leave to my grand son Walter Rowe the sum of Three hundred dollars and I leave to each of my grand children (the children of my son James H. Marchant being six in number) the sum of three hundred dollars each.

These pecuniary legacies, I direct my executor hereinafter named, to pay out of my personal estate as soon after my death as practicable.

I nominate and appoint my son John R. Marchant as the executor of this my last will and testament and request the Court not to require any security of him of my executor.
