tation with all the building thereon and at her death I give my

ever with this proviso that he is to pay to my daughter Laller
Rook Rowe the sum of three hundred and thirty dollars as fol-
lows one hundred and ten dollars with lawful interest there-
on in one year from the death of my wife Mary A. Massey
one hundred and ten dollars with lawful interest thereon in
two years from the death of my wife Mary A. Massey, and one
hundred and ten dollars with lawful interest thereon in three
years from the death of my wife Mary A. Massey.

3rd I loan to my wife Mary A. Massey all of my household
furniture and kitchen utensils together with all my farm-
ing implements during her natural life.

4th I give to my Mary A. Massey one dark brindle cow with all of her increase from this day together with my riding Carriage & harness to her and her heirs forever.

5th I give to my son John W. Massey all my stock of Cattle and hogs and he is to give to his mother every year during her life two or three hogs for the pen.

6th At the death of my wife Mary A. Massey the property located her I give to my son John W. Massey and Lalla Rook Rowe after the payment of any debts which may be due from my wife Mary A. Massey at her death to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever.

7th I appoint my son John W. Massey and my son in law Robert R. Rowe my Executors to this my last will and Testament and request that the Judge of the Court will allow them to qualify without giving any security.
