

Freeman In the name of God amen. I William Freeman of the County of  
William Gloucester and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory, thanks to the  
Almighty God for the same do make this my last will and Testament in manner  
and form to wit.

1<sup>st</sup> It is my will and desire that my Executor hereinafter named pay all my just  
debts out of such property as he shall think best.

2<sup>nd</sup> I leave unto my beloved wife Catharine Freeman during her life all of my  
real Estate with such negroes as she may want for the use of the farm with household  
and kitchen furniture, Farming Tools, stock of cattle and hogs and as much  
grain and produce as she may want for her comfort and support.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give unto my daughters Jane Smith and Mary Davies each a negro girl,  
the said negro are to be selected after my wife take out such as she may want  
and the girl that I shall give my daughter Ellen to them and their heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup> I give unto my daughter Ellen a negro girl Mary to her and her heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my two Sons Benjamin & William H Freeman all of my real  
estate after the death of my wife to be equally divided among them, also such of the  
household and kitchen furniture with the stock that my wife may take I give  
it to them with the real estate to them and their heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup> As I have given unto my son Thomas E. Freeman a negro girl to be sold  
and the money to be laid out in other property for the benefit of his wife and  
children.

7<sup>th</sup> The balance of my property I wish to be equally divided among all my chil-  
dren, to wit, Jane Smith, Thomas E, Mary Davies, Benjamin & William H  
and Ellen Freeman to them and their heirs.....

8<sup>th</sup> After the death of my wife, the negroes that she may leave I want to be equally  
divided as they can into six parts and that my sons Benjamin & Wil-

children.

7<sup>th</sup> The balance of my property I wish to be equally divided among all my children, to wit, Jane Smith, Thomas E, Mary Davis, Benjamin & William H and Ellen Freeman to them and their heirs . . . .

8<sup>th</sup> After the death of my wife the negroes that she may leave I want to be equally divided as they can into six parts and that my sons Benjamin & and Hale have it shall take choice, and the other four lots shall be allotted to Jane Smith, Thomas E, Mary Davis and Ellen to them and their heirs .

9<sup>th</sup> As the affairs of our country are in a very precarious situation about the Slave property and it being my wish and desire that my property shall be equally divided among my children.

If my negroes should leave and go off so that my daughters Jane Smith, Mary Davis and Ellen shall not come in for a negro girl each, then it is my will and desire that after the death of my wife my real estate and such property as she may leave to be equally divided among Jane Smith, Mary Davis, Benjamin & William H and Ellen, as I have given my son Thomas E a negro girl to be sold for the benefit of his wife and children, but if they should not leave so they can be divided as above I have stated then I wish this will to be in full force and virtue .

10<sup>th</sup> I appoint my son Benjamin & Freeman Executor to this my last will and testament and request of the Court to let him qualify without giving security.  
At witness my hand and seal this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of October 1862.

Item first - I leave all the property or my portion that's owned between me and my two Sisters Sarah & Rachell Smith, both personal & real estate & also my portion of the widow's share of my Father estate to the said Sarah & Rachell Smith during their natural lives.

2<sup>nd</sup> Item. I give the said property to Amnielad Smith my Brother, if the said Amnielad Smith should be dead before he heirs the said property, I give the same to his children living equally, this 2 day February 1850.

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At a Court of Quarterly Session begun and held for Gloucester County at the Courthouse on Monday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November 1855. This last will and testament of Frances Smith deceased was proved in open Court by the oaths of Ralph Rose and James R Berry two of the witnesses thereto subscribed and by the Court
