In the name of God amen. I William Hibble of Gloucester County Va do make this my last will and testament as follows, (that is to say) My desire is to be buried with as little expense as decency will permit and that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as conveniently may be. First, I bequeath unto my grand son George W. Hibble in testimo of his faithfulness to me in my old age that portion of my real estate on which I now reside consisting of eighty eight & 7/8 acres of land and all buildings thereon and appurtenances thereto, for his own absolute use & benefit and at his disposal. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Eliza Hibble that portion of my real estate in which she now resides consisting of eighty eight and 7/8 acres of land and all buildings thereon to hold and use the same during her natural life and at her death to be divided equally between her children lawfully begotten of the body by her late husband Charles W. Hibble, except as to George W. Hibble who in consideration of the above mentioned property which I have bequeathed to him, shall not be entitled to any part of said property given to Mary E. Hibble. I do furthermore give and bequeath to my daughter Mary A. Hibble all the personal property as set forth in a bill of sale made to me by Chas. W. Hibble on the 1st day of April 1874 and which is on record in the clerk's office of Gloucester County, to hold & use the same during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between her children lawfully begotten of the body by her late husband Chas. W. Hibble, with the aforesaid exception as to George W. Hibble who shall not receive any part of the said property. Thirdly, I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Ellen all of my household furniture and stock consisting of hogs sheep & cattle and I do hereby appoint my

✓ I use the same during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between her children lawfully begotten of the body by her late husband Char. W. Hibble, with the aforesaid exception as to George W. Hibble who shall not receive any part of the said property. Thirdly, I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Ellen all of my household furniture and stock consisting of hogs, sheep & cattle, and I do hereby appoint my grandson George W. Hibble trustee who shall keep said property in his possession and apply all proceeds arising therefrom to the support of my daughter Ellen, the said property to be used for the sole benefit of my daughter Ellen during the natural term of her natural life and at her death to be divided equally between my grand children. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend J. M. Shackelford as Executor of this my last will and Testament revoking all wills previously made by me; in testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 4th day of October 1876
