

Wm H Perrin's
"Will"

I William H Perrin of the County of Gloucester being of sound mind do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following hereby revoking and annulling all other wills heretofore made by me, that is to say. In the first place I bequeath to my wife Sarah J Perrin for the term of her natural life the dwelling house and the household and Kitchen furniture at Goshen the place of my residence together with the servants attached to the household at the time of my death and the Carriage and Carriage horses for her sole use and enjoyment so long as she shall live. I also give my wife for and during her life, One third of the profits of all my estates hereinafter devised to my sons.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my grand Children Perrin Wyndham and Emily Kemp, the Children of my deceased daughter Ann S Kemp or the Survivor or Survivors of them at my death Ten thousand dollars to be paid out of the money due me from Robert W and Andrew S Nicolson for property in Alabama sold by me to them. The bonds for the sale of the property in Alabama executed to me by the said Robert W and Andrew S Nicolson. I have already placed in the hands of my Son in law Wyndham Kemp Esq with instructions to him to apply Ten thousand dollars of money due thereby when collected for the benefit of my said grand Children and this is to be in full satisfaction of the above bequest to them. I also give to my said grand Children or the survivors or survivor of them at my death, all the interest I have and am entitled to in the estate of the late Mann Page Esq of Shelly, the said estate having been lately divided there with in 2nd and 3rd parts.

Estate I Perish for the term of her natural life the dwelling house and the household and kitchen furniture at Goshen the place of my residence together with the servants attached to the household at the time of my death and the Carriage and Carriage horses for her sole use and enjoyment so long as she shall live, I also give my wife for and during her life, One Third of the profits of all my estates hereinafter devised to my sons.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my grand Children Perrin Wyndham and Emily Kemp, the children of my deceased daughter Ann S Kemp or the survivor or survivors of them at my death Ten thousand dollars to be paid out of the money due me from Robert H. and Andrew S. Nicolson for property in Alabama sold by me to them. The bonds for the sale of the property in Alabama executed to me by the said Robert H. and Andrew S. Nicolson. I have already placed in the hands of my Son-in-law Wyndham Kemp Esq. with instructions to him to apply Ten thousand dollars of money due thereby when collected for the benefit of my said grand Children and this is to be in full satisfaction of the above bequest to them. I also give to my said grand Children or the survivors or survivor of them at my death, all the interest I have and am entitled to in the estate of the late Mann Page Esq. of Shelly, the said estate having been lately divided. I have authorized my said Son-in-law to receive my share thereof and hold the same for the benefit of ^{my said} Grand Children. Having already given to my Son-in-law Wyndham Kemp considerable property. I have

tract I purchased from Menden G Walker containing fifty
Six acres and that purchased from John T. Dobson and
Sarah G his wife containing thirty Six acres. I also give to
him all the Stock Crops plantation utensils &c which may
be at the time of my death on the land hereby given to him
Fifthly. I wish all my Slaves Except Warner and Betty that
I have given to my Son William K to be equally divided be-
tween my two Sons William K Perrin and John T Perrin
So that the Shares of each Exclusively of the two given to my
Son William K shall be of equal Value.

Sixthly. I wish all my debts to be paid and after payment
of my debts, I give whatever money I may have and all
debts due to me at the time of my death to my two Sons
to be equally divided between them. The legacy of ten thous-
and dollars which I have bequeathed to my grand children
is to be paid out of the bonds of Robert H and Andrew S
Kieson which I have placed in the hands of my son in
law Wm H Kemp and from no other source whatever
the property I have given my Sons is to be taken by them
Subject to the provision I have made in favor of my wife
Seventhly. It is my will that if either of my said Sons
should die before he attains to his age of twenty one years
and without issue then and in that case I give the whole
of my property hereby given to them to my said grand Chil-
dren or the Survivors or survivor of them.

Eighthly. I hereby appoint my sons William Kemm
