Amen, I William Smith of the County of Gloucester & State of Virginia do make this my last will & testament as follows, that is to say: My desire is to be buried with as little expence as decency will permit, and that all of my debts and funeral expences be paid as soon after my decease as conveniently may be. And I give all of my personal property whatsoever to my daughter Sterly Ann Smith and I give to my daughter Sally Smith one acre of land, laid land joining the land of Warner Smith & others, and to my daughter Sterly Ann Smith I give the remainder of my land amounting to three Acres more or less, including the house in which I now live, and all improvements thereon whatsoever. I also give to my daughter Sterly Ann Smith any and all property, personal & real whatsoever not mentioned in this will, which I may possess at my death,

I do hereby appoint my daughter Sterly Ann Smith Executrix of this my last will and on the qualification of my said daughter on my estate, I direct and request, that no security be required of her
