Ellison Notary Public of the City of New York State of New York of the due execution of the said Commission; and thereupon the said certificate having been seen and inspected by the Court, it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as the last will and testament of the said Joe Van Antwerp deceased, and on motion of John W. Van Antwerp, one of the Executors named in said will who made oath as the law directs, and entered in a bond in the penalty of Two hundred dollars, Conditioned according to law with W. H. Martin his security therein, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, and which said Bond, being acknowledged by the obligors therein, is ordered to be recorded, Certificate is granted the said J. W. Van Antwerp, for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form. The other Executor named in said will being dead.
