

In the Name of God Amen. Bartholomew Dwyer of Yorkland County and in
King William Parish Virginia being sick in body but of good and perfect memory
thanks be to the Almighty God, and calling to remembrance the uncertain state
of this transitory life, and that all flesh must yield unto death, when it shall please
the Almighty God to call, do make constitute ordain and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament and none other and in manner and form following. Revok-
ing and annulling by these presents all and every Testament or Testaments Will or Wills
heretofore by me made or declared, either by word or writing and this only to be
taken only for my last Will and Testament and none other. And first being
penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past most humbly
desiring forgiveness for the same, I give and commit my soul unto the Almighty
God my Savior and Redeemer, In whom and by whose merits I trust and believe
expressly to be saved and to have full Remission and forgiveness for all my sins
past, and that my soul with my body at the General Day of Resurrection shall
rise again with Joy, and through the merits of Christs death and passion possess and
inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his elect and chosen, And my body to
be lawfully Buried in such place as it shall please my Executors hereafter named

And for the better setting my Temporal Estate Surh good Chattels and implements
as it has pleased the Almighty God to bestow on me above my debts, order and
dispose the same in manner and form following / That is to say I will that those
debts and Duties as I owe in Right and Conscience to any manner of person or
persons whatsoever shall be well and truly contented and paid or ordained to
be paid within convenient time after my decease by my Executor hereafter
Named.

Item I give and bequeath to my Eldest Son Peter Dupuy five pounds Virginia Currency to
him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son John James Dupuy Ten pounds Virginia Currency
to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson John Bartholomew Dupuy Son to Peter
Dupuy two pounds Virginia Currency to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to the Poor of King William Parish five pounds Current money.

Item It is my Will and Desire is that my Son in Law John Levitt Junior shall be
Executor of this my last Will and Testament. And further I give and bequeath
all my whole and sole Estate that I shall possess and have at my Death unto
my aforesaid Son in Law John Levitt Junior to him and his heirs forever.

And I do acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament and no other.

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson John Bartholomew Dupuy son to Peter Dupuy two pounds Virginia currency to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to the Poor of King William Parish five pounds current money.

Item My Will and Desire is that my son in Law John Levilain Junior shall be Executor of this my last Will and Testament. And further I give and bequeath all my whole and sole Estate that I shall possess and have at my Death unto my aforesaid Son in Law John Levilain to him and his heirs forever.

And I do acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament and now other and I renounce to all Laws and Customs that are contrary to this my last Will and Testament. At Witness my hand and seal this 7th day of March 1742/3.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Stephen Dittall & Stephen Watkins Witnesses hereto to be the Act and Deed of Bartholomew Dupuy Deceased and was thereupon Ordered to be Recorded.
