Item. I give & bequeath to my Son John Payne with his heirs forever their increase to him & his heirs forever but not taking them from his mother during her Widowhood.

1. I give & bequeath to my son Josias Payne my Negro fellow Peter together
with my cloth to him & his heirs forever but not taking them from
his mother during her widowhood.

2. I give & bequeath to my son George Payne my Negro woman Ann w.
her increase hereafter together w.th my Copper little to him & his heirs
forever but not taking them from his mother during her widowhood.

3. My will is that my Negro fellow Tom be publicly sold by way of Auction
by my three sons Josias George and John & whoever of them will give
the most to take him & pay the other two their proportional part of what he
sold for.

4. I give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Agnes Payne my Negro boy
named Jamey & her heirs forever but not taking him from her
Grandmother during her widowhood.

5. I give & bequeath to my Grandson Augustine Payne my Negro girl
named Sammer together w.th a feather bed & furniture to the value of
fifty pounds to him & his heirs forever.

6. I give & bequeath to my Grandson Jesse Payne my Negro girl named
Patto to him & his heirs forever.

7. I give to my son John Payne all my Books & papers & am^t to him & his

I give to my two Sons Josias & George Payne & my Grandson Augustine Payne Eight hundred acres of Land lying on the branches of the Little River to be equally divided amongst them & their heirs forever but if in case my s. Grandson Augustine Payne should dye with Out heir then my Will is that the said Negro Girl named Danner before mentioned and likewise his part of the above mentioned Eight hundred acres of Land be valued & equally divided amongst my three Sons Josias George & John or to their heirs as they can agree and as to my Stock of horses Cattle Sheep & hogs And all the rest of my household goods I leave to my loving Wife Mary Payne above mentioned during her widowhood & then to be equally divided amongst my three Sons Josias George & John and their heirs forever.

I give to my Son George Payne four hundred acres of Land lying on Licking hole Creek in which he is now in possession of to him and his heirs forever. I likewise do appoint my three Sons Josias George & John Payne to be my Executors of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 3rd day of March 1741

in case my s. grandson Augustine Payne should Die with Out heir
then my Will is that the said Negro Girl named Isamer before men-
tioned and likewise his part of the above mentioned light hundred
acres of Land be valued & equally divided amongst my three Sons

I leave to my loving Wife Mary Payne above mentioned during her
widowhood & then to be equally divided amongst my three Sons Josias
