I John to Villain born in the town of Jussy in lower Normandy in the Kingdom of France &c but at this present Living in King William parish in Yorkland County in Virginia being sick and weak but thanks be to my God Almighty in my right senses and perfect memory have thought proper to make this my last will and testament in the following manner. First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of my God of whom I had it in hopes that by the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ I shall receive a Joyfull resurrection of Eternal Life, and my Body to be decently Entombed in the manner my Executors shall think fit.

I give and devise unto my most dear and well beloved Son John Peter to Villain one half of the plantation whereon I now live to wit, the two hundred acres that are patented in my name for him and his heirs forever.

Item. I leave and give to the said ^{John} Peter to Villain my negro pater, my negro mary and a little negro girl named Olive for him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my most dear and well beloved Son Anthony to Villain the plantation which I bought of Col. Thomas Randolph joining to this I now live upon and containing about five hundred

I give and devise unto my most dear and well beloved Son John Peter Lovillain
one half of the plantation whereon I now live to wit, the two hundred
acres that are patented in my name for him and his heirs forever

Item. I leave and give to the said ^{John} Peter Lovillain my negro peter, my negro
mary and a little negro girl named Olive for him and his heirs forever

Item. I give and devise unto my most dear and well beloved Son Anthony
Lovillain the plantation which I bought of Col. Thomas Randolph
joining to this I now live upon and containing about two hundred
acres for him and his heirs forever to enjoy it at their pleasure.

Item. I leave and give unto him my negro Lazar my negro nenny and a
little negro boy called Dirk for him and his heirs to enjoy them at
their pleasure forever.

Item. I also leave and give unto him my young horse pinto my arms
and my wearing apparels.

Item. I do leave to have given to my dear and well beloved daughter Suran-
nah one young negro boy named Robert and one young negro
girl named Betty for her and her heirs forever to enjoy them at their
pleasure.

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Item. I leave and give to my well beloved god daughter Olimpo Dupuy four
guineas.

Item. I leave and give to the poor of the parish ten shillings.

Item. I leave and give to my three dear and well beloved children to wit, John
Peter LeVillain, Anthony LeVillain and Surannah Dupuy the two plan-
tations that I have in Somers County on the North side of Appomattox
containing each 400 acres of land that they may be divided Equally a-
mongst the three above named for them and their heirs forever.

Item. I leave and give to my dear and well beloved Son Anthony Nine Spanish
Pistols in gold, one sword and five guineas which are at present
in my chest he shall out of that pay all my Debts and what shall
remain keep for himself and his heirs forever.

Item. I leave and give all my movables and immovables remaining that
the whole be Equally divided and without Appraisement Among my
said three children above named to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I declare name and Ordain my said two Sons John Peter LeVillain and
Anthony LeVillain to be Executors of this my present and last will and
testament in Witness whereof and of all above mentioned I have
signed with my own hand and affixed my Seal in presence of the ~

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Item I leave and give all my moveables and immovables remaining that the whole be equally divided and without Appraisment Among my said three Children above named to them and their heirs forever.

Item I declare name and Ordain my said two Sons John Peter LeVillain and Anthony LeVillain to be Executors of this my present and last will and Testament in Witnes whereof and of all above mentioned I have signed with my own hand and affixed my Seal in presence of the Witnesses underneath this 18th day of April 1746
