

Giles Allegre Thomas Givodon, Isaac Salts.

At a Court held for Yeochland County June 17. 1746.

Giles Allegre proved this Writing to be a true translation of the last Will and Testament of John LeVillain deceased and it was Ordered to be Recorded.

In the name of God Amen I Obadiah Cupin of Yeochland County Widdow being weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory Blessed be God so make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

Impremis I first of all give and bequeath unto my son John Leke and to his heirs forever one negro boy named Harthing.

Item. I give unto my Daughter Martha Friend five Shillings.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grandson William Moseley one Negro boy named Pompey but not to be delivered till Christmas next.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Benjamin Moseley one negro

boy named Frank to him and his heirs forever but not to be delivered to him until the said Willoughby shall arrive to the age of eighteen years

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Alexander Grant one negro girl named Dickey to him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my son Alexander Grant five Shillings

Item I give unto my Daughter Obedience Branch five Shillings

Item I give to my Grand daughter Obedience Branch one Negro girl named Sally to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Good one Negro boy named Matt to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my Grand Daughter Obedience Curpin three negroes to wit Amy a girl, Lucy a girl, Harry a boy to her and her heirs forever

I likewise give to my said Grand Daughter Obedience One feather bed a pair of Blankets, two pair of Sheets one Ring, one bed Quilt half a dozen new Leather Chairs which I have now by me four new dishes half a dozen new plates one Chest and small Walnut Table

Item I give and Bequeath to my son Thomas Curpin three Negroes to wit Pompey, Simon and Samual to him and his heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Good one Negro boy named Matt to her and her heirs forever

dozen new Leather Chairs which I have now by me four new dishes  
half a dozen new plates one Chest and small Walnut Table.

Item. I give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Curpin Three Negroes to wit  
Dorsey, Simon and Sammah to him and his heirs forever

Item. I give to my Daughter Mary Good five Shillings.

Item. All the Rest of my Estate which I have not before disposed of I give  
to my Son Thomas Curpin and do Appoint him Sole Executor of this  
my last Will and Testament revoking all Wills by me heretofore  
made and do Order that my Estate be not Appraised in Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty Sixth day of  
January 1745/6.
