Witnesses hereto to be the Act and Deed of Bartholomew Dupuy Deceased
and was thereupon Ordered to be Recorded.

In the Name of God Amen. Peter Marton of the County of Yorkland
being sick and weak but of sound mind and ^{perfect} memory thanks be to almighty
God do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following. First and principally I do commend my Soul to God
who gave it me hoping through the merits of our Lord and Saviour Jesus
Christ to have free pardon of all my sins and a joyful Resurrection at
the last day. Item I give unto my Son Anthony One negro boy named Will
and a negro girl named Jenny to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give

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also to said Son Anthony the plantation wher on I now ~~live~~ to him and his
heirs forever. and also one feather bed and furniture three cows and calves
and three sows and piggs, one gun six pewter plates three dishes & two basons
to him and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my said Son Anthony one look-
ing glass and one table and as much fine linen as will make three table
cloaths also one horse a bridle and saddle to him and his heirs forever. Item
I give unto my Son John the plantation which my father John Martin left
me by Will adjoining to the plantation of Will^m Randolph at Enkiahoe to him
and his heirs forever. ~~also~~ one girl named Betty and one negro boy named
Matt to him the said John and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my said
Son John three cows and calves and three sows and piggs also one feather
bed and furniture six pewter plates three dishes and two basons also one horse
and bridle and saddle, one table also as much fine linen as will make three
table cloaths and also one looking glass to him and his heirs forever. Item
I give unto my Son Peter two hundred Acres of Land adjoining to his Uncle
Samuel Pero's plantation to him and his heirs forever also one negro woman
named Kate and one negro girl named Hannah with all their furniture
to him and his heirs forever. ~~also~~ I give unto my said Son Peter sixty pounds
current money one feather bed and furniture also three cows and calves

horses and Bridle and Saddle to him and his heirs for my will and desire is
that my Wife Mother should take one my children to bring and abet to
have one of the rooms in the new house when finished which she was to
during her life and also to support and maintain out of my Estate during
her natural life and in case my Wife should marry after my death than my
Will is that her Mother shall enjoy the new house wholly and solely
during her natural life. Item I give unto my three sons Anthony John and
Peter my part of my Father John Martin's personal Estate after my Mother
decease to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs respectively
forever. Item I give unto each of my sons aforesaid an Iron Pot. Item I give
unto my Dear beloved Wife three Negroes named Peter Daniel and Dick
during her natural life and the residue of my Estate I give unto my loving
Wife whom I appoint executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all other Wills heretofore made to all intents purposes whatsoever.
In Witness whereof I hath hereunto set my hand and Seal this 6th day of March
1742. My Will is before signed that if either one of my sons
should die before he comes to Lawfull age that his legacy should be equally
divided between the other two that shall survive to them and their heirs
respectively forever In Witness whereof I hath hereunto set my hand and

Seal the day and year aforesaid. My desire is not to appraise my Estate.
