wife forever, and also one feather bed and furniture three four and half feet
and three bows and Diggs, one him six pewter plates, three dishes and two bowls
to him and his wife forever. Item I give unto my said Son Anthony one look-
ing glass and one Table and as much fine dinner as will make three Table-
cloths also one horse, a bridle and saddle to him and his wife forever. Item.
I give unto my son John the Plantation which my Father John Martin left
me by Will adjoining to the Plantation of Willm Randolph at Turk's Head to him
and his wife forever. ~~also one child named Bosy and one negro boy named~~
At Call to him the said John and his wife forever. Item I give unto my said
Son John three bows and calves and three bows and Diggs also one feather
bed and furniture six pewter plates three dishes and two bowls also one horse
and bridle and saddle, one Table also as much fine dinner as will make three
Table cloths and also one looking glass to him and his wife forever. Item.
I give unto my son Peter two hundred acres of land joining to his late
~~deceased~~ Father's Plantation to him and his wife forever also one negro youth
named State and one negro girl named Samah with all their tressels
to him and his wife forever. Item I give unto my said son Peter Sixty pounds
currant money one feather bed and furniture also three bows and calves

word and Bridle and saddle to him and his heirs for my will and desire is
that my wife & all others should take one my children to bring up & also to
have one of the rooms in the new house when finished which she was as
During her life and also to support and maintain out of my estate during
her natural life and in case my wife should marry after my death than my
will is that her all other shall enjoy the new house wholly and solely
During her natural life item I give unto my third son Anthony John and
Peter my part of my father John Carters personal estate after my death
to be equally divided between them to him and their heirs respectively
forever. Item I give unto each of my sons aforesaid an Iron Pott. Item I give
unto my dear beloved wife three Negro men named Peter Daniel and Dick
during her natural life and the residue of my estate I give unto my living
wife whom I appoint executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby
repealing all other Wills not so formed to all intents & purposes whatsoever.
In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this 6th day of March
1742.

My Will is so far signed that if either one of my Sons
Should die before he comes to a full age that his legacy should be equally
divided between the other two that shall survive to them and their heirs
respectively for ever in Witness whereof I have unto set my hand and
