Moulbry a Negro man Benfor a Negroman Lukker a Negrowoman
during her Natural and also one third of my Stock and household
goods during her Natural life and also her Right of Dower in my
land and houses as the directs during her Natural life. Item I give
to my Daughter Sarah Mosby Six Negroes named as followeth
viz. Epio a Negro boy Laure a Negro Gallo John a Negro boy
with a Negro boy James a Negro boy further a Negro Woman she
and her Increase after mother's decease the said Negroes to her and
heirs forever also one feather Bed and furniture to the value of
Ten pounds and also one Horse and Saddle to the value of Ten pounds
and also Twenty pounds current money and also she shall be brought
up near of her Estate till she arrive to Eighteen years or married
Item. I give to my Son Micajah Mosby all the rest of my Estate
both Real and Personal to him and his heirs for ever and also
If my Son Micajah Mosby should Die without Issue my Desire is

Conpounds and also one Saddle and Saddle to the Value of Conpounds
and also Twenty pounds current money and also she shall be brought
up (near of her Estate till she arrivs to eighteen years or married
Item. I give to my Son Micajah Mosby all the rest of my Estate
both Rayal and Parsonal to him and his heirs for ever and also
If my Son Micajah Mosby should Die without Issue my Desire is
that my Cousin Richard Mosby Son of Benjamin Mosby should
have four hundred Acres of Land upon the upper part of my Land
begging at my line upon the Schoolhouse branch and so concluding
the Ordinary to him and his heirs forever and also If my Daughter
Nanah Mosby should Die without Issue my Desire is that my
Brother Benjamin Mosby should have the Rest of my Land he and
his heirs forever Item I leave my Son Micajah Mosby and my
Brother Benjamin Mosby to be whole and sole Executors of this
my last Will and Testament and also I desire y^t my Estate should
not come to any appraisment as Witnesses my hand and Seal this
the thirteenth Day of March 1745/6

This Writing was proved by the Oaths of Stephen Bedford and Francis Amos to be the Last Will and Testament of Richard Mofby deceased which was Ordered to be Recorded.

This Indenture made the Seventeenth Day of June in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Six Between John Masey of the County of Goochland planter of the part and John Pleasants of the County of Seneca gent. of the other part Whereas the said John Masey stands Justly Indebted unto the said John Pleasants of the Sum of Twenty three pounds Six Shill^{ings} & 4. current money Now this In-
