to almighty God and as for my Worldly Goods I give as followeth my  
will and Desire is that after my Just Debts and funorall Charges be  
paid then I give as followeth the rest of my Estate.

Item I give to my Godson Robert Walker son of William Walker  
all my Lands belonging to me and ten pounds Cash out of the money  
as Charles Lewis owes me and no more.

Item I give to John Darris son of John Darris living on  
Moors Creek five pounds out of the money as the said Lewis owes me  
and no more.

Item I give to Tom Glafs son of James Glafs five pounds Cash.

Item I give Samuel Williams three pounds Cash no more.

Item I give to William Williams son of William Williams One  
thousand pound of Tobacco in John Flemings hands.

Item I give to my friend James Glafs all my hold Crop of Tobacco  
and more as I made at m. Goochland County, Virginia Wills 1715-1749  
www.virginiapioneer.net John Randolphs in the year of our Lord  
1746 for his Trouble of Looking after me and Buruing of me.

Item I give to John Roberts five pounds Cash & my horse bridle and saddle and the remainder of my scribling debts if to be found as far as amounts to five or six pounds to be Equally Divided between John Roberts and Samuel Williams.

Item I give to Sarah Roberts my trunk & all my Iron ware also I give to my friend James Glas all my wearing floss and one hide of Leather.

Item I give to William Williams three hides of Leather and no more. Also I do ordain and appoint my Loving friend James Glas and John Roberts my heirs and Sole Executors of this my last will & testament Given under my hand and Seal this thirteenth Day of Decr. 1746.
