it has pleased go to bless me I give devise and dispose off in manners
and form following.

In primis I give and bequeath to my youngest
Son James Clements my land and plantation where I now live contain-
ing one hundred and twenty nine acres to him and his heirs forever
I give and bequeath to John Simons son of William Simons
the plantation where the said William Simons now lives with fifty
acres of land adjoining according to a dividing line made by the said
William Simons and my self he it more or less taking him and his heirs

of be it of what kind soever. I leave to my loving wife Elizabeth Clements
 during her Natural life and at her decease to be Equally divided amongst
 all my Children then living and lastly I constitute make and ordain
 my loving wife Elizabeth Clements Sole Executrix of this my last will
 and Testament In Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand
 and Seal the day and year above written. Signed sealed and Delivered
 by the said Stephen Clements as his last Will and testament in the
 presence of us the subscribers
