The 19th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one
 I Michael Watson of the County of Wayson and State of Mo^o being through the blessing of God in a sound state of mind and memory, but calling to mind the frail tenure of this life and that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say I give bequeath and dispose of it, in the manner following, First, I desire that all my property be sold after my decease, and out of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts be paid. And after my just debts being paid, I give unto my dear children here named, Henry Watson, David Watson, Margaret King, Sally McCarry and Nancy Spence, each the sum of One dollar to be paid to them out of the monies arising from the sale of my property. And then I desire that John Burns (commonly called John Watson) and Lucy Burns have all the balance of my estate exclusively to and for themselves and their heirs to be equally divided between them the said John Burns and Lucy Burns. I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Fielders L. Hald Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby making no other or former Wills or Testaments, by me herebefore made - His Wishes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of May in the year 1841. Wayson County Court July Term 1841.
 This last Will and Testament of Michael Watson dec^d was produced in Court, perused by the oath of Joseph Day Jr and Michael Spinant subscribing witnesses hereto and was ordered to be recorded. And as the nature of Fielders L. Hald the Executor herein named who made oath hereto and together with James Anderson of his security, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of \$400.00 of Condition as the law direct. Certificate is granted the said Fielders L. Hald for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.
