in manner and form following, that is to say: 1st I desire that all my lawful Debts and burial expenses be first paid, 2nd I give and bequeath unto my eldest Daughter Ruth Warner (Daughter of my former wife) one Dollar over and above what I have already given her, 3rd I give unto my eldest son Nathan Cox (son of my former wife) one dollar over and above what I have given him heretofore, 4th I give unto my second son Valamer Cox (son of my former wife) one Dollar over and above what I have given him heretofore, 5th I give unto my third son Ernah Cox (son of my former wife) one Dollar over and above what I have already given him, 6th I give unto my second daughter Polly Love God (Daughter of my former wife) ten dollars over and above what I have given her heretofore, 7th I give unto fourth son Jesse Cox (son of my former wife) one Dollar over and above what I have given him heretofore, 8th I give unto fifth and last son of my former wife Perminah Cox two hundred acres of Land lying on the north east part of the plantation on which I now live including the house in which the said Perminah Cox now resides over and above what I have given her heretofore, 9th My will is that all my real and personal estate be vested in the hands of my last wife Sally Cox and Mark D. Stoneman both my exors, and to be by them applied in the best and most economical manner for raising and educating my last set of children namely Joshua, Elizabeth, Mary and John Cox infant children of my last wife Sally Cox 10th I request that no inventory of my personal property be taken and appointed and tested I do hereby constitute the above mentioned Sally Cox my wife and Mark D. I Jabez Johnson of Grayson County and state of Virginia do hereby make my last Will and Testament in witnesses and form following that is to say 1st I give to my wife Polly the land I now live on during her natural life and after her decease to belong to my youngest son Greenberry; also I give her all my household and kitchen furniture except three beds and furniture also I give her ~~the~~ the east end and a yoke of Oxen four cows and calves with all my sheep and all my hogs for the use of the family during her life or widowhood and after her death to be equally divided among all my children 2nd I give to my son John all my land lying up the creek on both sides from Daniel Johnsons line up to a cross fence 3rd I give to my son Alexander all my land between the above named cross fence up the creek on both sides to the mouth of a big ditch called the long ditch thence west to the back line also my steel cots and one bed and furniture, and fifty dollars to be made out of the property that I give to my wife at her decease 4th I give to my son Lewis one hundred and thirty four acres of land lying both sides of the cow mine branch known by the name of Blankens tract also I give him the western part of a tract of land lying on the water of Lovels Creek beginning at an old path leading from the Elk spur to the good spur road thence with that path through the plantation to back line also one hundred and thirty acres of land over the mountain lying both sides of the good spur road known by the name of Gandons place on the water of Little road Island Creek also a small tract of land known by the name of Huffs place also I give him one bed and furniture 5th I give to my son Greenberry all my land from Alexanders line up the creek on both sides up to the good spur road ^{for my wife decess} also one bed and furniture 6th I give to my daughter Elizabeth the Eastern part of a tract of land lying on the water of Lovels Creek below the old path leading from Elk spur to the good spur road but if she dies with out issue this land to belong to my son Lewis 7th It is my will that the rest of my property (my farming tools excepted) and for them to remain on the place for the use of the farm the balance to be sold and after my just debts is paid I give my daughter Frances one dollar also I give to my son Reziak one dollar and the remainder of the money left to be equally divided between William, Martha, Nereb, John, Alexander, Lewis Greenberry and Elizabeth, the witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my
