By virtue of an order the Court of Grayson County July term 1838 the said Frederick Cuesenberg and Wm Lindsey proceeded to lay off and assign to Catharine Shippen the widow of James Shippen dec^d by metes and bounds the lands of which her husband died seized in this County, being
