This last Will and Testament of William Oglesby deceased was produced and Court viewed by the oaths of Civille Anderson and James Ballard, subscribing witnesses hereto and was ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Mary Oglesby and Michael Oglesby the Executor herein named who made oath hereto and together with Egidius Nickolls, James Anderson, J. Lewis Nickolls and James Anderson, their securities entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of \$2000 Conditioned as the law directs, Certificate was granted them for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.

I give unto my Children namely, Sally Parks, William Brewer & Ann from County to be equally divided so the proceeds of the same as the choice. I give unto my wife my young man to belong when the balance of my penible property & my outstanding debt to be collected & my just debt & funeral expenses paid & the remainder to belong to Rufus & William Brewer with the exception of my Clock. I give unto my beloved Brewer & my large Family Bible to my Daughters Sally Parks & the balance of my Books to be divided among my Children as they wish. I appoint my son Martin my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Given under my hand this 20th day of March 1837.

I James Stoneman Jr of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia being in tolerable health considering my great age, and of sound mind and memory I do thus make and publish this my last Will and Testament in form and manner following: First, my will is that all my just debt be first paid out of my estate by my Executor hereafter named. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Stoneman one bay horse and saddle that she now rides, two Cows, all my sheep, hogs and sheep and fruit, privilege to live in the house we now live in and to have her maintenance as and of the plantation and fuel, privilege for her stock and them & up with food and during her natural life in and around. Thirdly, I give and devise unto my youngest son John Stoneman all my trade of land wherever I now live to be by him freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever excepting such Privileges I have given to his mother during her life and widowhood and the said John is to have the oversight and take care of the mother for her subsistence and further, I give and bequeath unto my son John all my goods that I now have both plantations and other of whatsoever description. Fourthly, I give and devise unto my son James Stoneman one dollar in part of my property and unto my three daughters namely Elizabeth Cole, Sarah Kinney and Hannah Davis I give and bequeath one dollar in part of my property to each of them severally and unto my eldest son John Stoneman the sum of Ten Cents and no more of my estate as also my will is that all my aforesaid Children (except my youngest son John) have no more of my estate than what I have specified and the balance that I have given to my wife or so much thereof that may be left after my wife's decease I also give to my son John provided that he take care of her during his lifetime & Fifthly, I do hereby appoint my eldest son John Stoneman to be my only executor of this my last Will and Testament and further I do hereby acknowledge and declare this and no other to be my last Will and Testament here by revoking and annulling all former Wills or Testaments heretofore by me made and in hand. Stoneman both my executor, and to be by them applied in the best and most economical manner for raising and educating my last set of children namely Joshua, Elizabeth, Mary and John Cox infant children of my last wife Sally Cox 10th I request that no inventory of my personal property be taken and appointed and testify I do hereby constitute the above mentioned Sally Cox my wife and Mark D. Stoneman executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made, the contents whereof I have heretofore set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st of 3rd Mo. 1840.
