heirs. Article the third. I wish my property equally distributed among
all my children. I wish my son Lewis to receive his proportion and
one hundred and twenty five acres of land where he now lives.
I wish my daughter Polly to have one hundred acres of land
as to attain the improvement where she now lives during her
life and at her death to go to her heirs. I bequeath one hundred
and fifty acres of land to my son Ebenezer where he now lives

tract of land should be valued higher than another, the one having the
most valuable tract shall pay over to my estate so as to make all my
children equal. I leave James Anderson Jr. my Commissioner. I wish
the residue of my property disposed of in a way that the proceeds can
