This account of the sale of the personal estate of Benjamin Shippo dec^d was produced in Court and ordered to be recorded.

The 19th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one
I Michael Watson of the County of Wayson and State of Iowa being through the blessing of God in a sound state of mind and memory, but Calling to mind the frail tenure of this life and that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say I give bequeath and dispose of it, in the manner following, First, I desire that all my property be sold after my decease, and out of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts be paid. And after my just debts being paid I give unto my dear children here named, Henry Watson, David Watson, Margaret (Wing) Sally McCarroll and Mary Spence, each the sum of One dollar to be paid to them out of the money arising from the sale of my property. And then I desire that John Dunn (commonly called John Watson) and Lucy Dunn have all the balance of my estate exclusively to and for themselves and their heirs to be equally divided between them the said John Dunn and Lucy Dunn. I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Fieldens L. Hald Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby making also, other or former Wills or Testaments, by me herebefore made - his Wishes, whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of May in the year 1841. Signed, sealed, published and declared by Michael Watson as his last Will and Testament, in the presence of the subscribers who subscribe in his presence and at his request -

Wayson County Court July Term 1841.
This last Will and Testament of Michael Watson dec^d was produced in Court, proved by the oath of Joseph Day Jr and Attestes E. Spinant subscribing witnesses hereto and was ordered to be recorded. And as the nature of Fieldens L. Hald the Executor herein named who made oath hereto and together with James Anderson of his security, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of \$400.00 of Condition as the law direct. Certificate is granted the said Fieldens L. Hald for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.
