Will

I Peter Dept of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia do hereby
make this my last will and Testament in these words and form
following 1st after my decease I desire that all my just debts & funeral
expenses be paid out of my estate 2^d I give and bequeath unto James
Albright all my lands that I now own part of especially the tract of land
where I now live with all and according the appurtenances thereto
belonging for his own prospers and benefit after my decease And I
give and bequeath unto the said James Albright all my horses, cattle, sheep
sheep for breeding, hogs, swine, hens, fowls and other live creatures
as a man full what I possess at my death except this article hereunder named
and reserved for Peggy Dept, 3^d I give and bequeath unto Peggy Dept, all
chests, bars, beds, furniture, sleds, sleds, one cupboard, two feet and a half wide
one three shelves, two sets of plates, and one set of knives, forks, and spoons
two good old sets of bed and bedding, 4^d I give and bequeath
one with a whitewash and a quarter red and white pidgeon, seven head of
sheep one set of tea & spittoons, 5^d I give and bequeath, one cow, & cattle
I give her three hens, one young Pidgeon, & one peacock Basin or small basin
baskets, and two grape vine stalks, one seven bushels dry corn, six pounds
dry beans, five bushels dry, one pair of Scuppernong bunches, one bushel they
are double stalks and well called, Green platters, two of them painted and
one in the plate 6^d I do hereby constitute and appoint Stephen Hall
for Executor of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of January
1st 1847

This List of the sales and Settlement of Peter
Dept's dead, was passed according to law by the order of Jacob D. Morrison, Clerk
of St. Lucie County, Justice, and it is now ready to be recorded. But as the
Constitutor thereon named was not being present it is resolved that he be
convened and to this next term to execute his duty and qualify concerning
the same. St. Lucie County Court October term 1847. On motion of Stephen
Hall, Jr. the Constitutor named on the last Will and Settlement of Peter
Dept dead, who resides at "Hawks" and together with John Dickinson
his son-in-law entered into and acknowledged a bond in the fourth

of \$1000 conditioned as the last above Certificate is granted him for drawing
a part of the said sum in due course.

Spencer Doms
Will

In the name of God, Amen. I Spencer Doms of the County of Gloucester and State
of Virginia being very weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks
be given unto God, calling unto mind the remembrance of my body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and conclude this
my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I
give and recommend myself unto the hands of Almighty God that gave
it and my body successively to this earth to be buried in Christians burial
at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive this down again by the Almighty power of God and to have
such worthy estate wherewithal it may please God to keep me in this life I give
service and disposal of the same in the following manner and form of first
I make and appoint my wife Elizabeth to be my Executrix and Andrew
Campbell executor of this my last Will and Testament, all my just debts to
be paid in the first place and any estate to be divided as follows I give and bequeath
to my wife Elizabeth some of the ~~as the~~ longest eleven to hold the land now having on
my future. Beginning at the mouth of ~~the~~ river between the two plantations little
long a large white rock on the edge of the River then running up the stream to the head
then to a corner of a hundred and fifty acres, with the side bounded and fifty
square yards distance to William Andersons line belonging to where I now live except
what I have deeded away there during the time to the beginning to be left in the
plantation in necessary houses as will be sufficient to carry on the farm of the same
house and so many cows and their stocks of all kinds as also is the longest house
white from the top, and the bottom to be sold, and the black and white
house to remain on the piece till my death, there to be sold amongst James, Philip,
Peter, Cynthia, Rebecca, John, James H., and my Grand son John R. Lewis & the slaves it one
lot to be sold by the above heirs and no other person to buy, and the money to be
equally divided amongst all my heirs and my grand son John R. Lewis, to have an
equal share with one of my heirs. I bequeath to my son James H. Lewis the old place
where we now live at my death, and the stock with tools to be equally between James H.
Lewis and John R. Lewis. I bequeath to my Grand son John R. Lewis a tract of land
beginning at the mouth of a stream, the first stream above the white Rock running up
the stream to the line of 150 acres with that line a few poles to the west line, then
bounding on Gloucester Hollies & Campbell line, to the River thence up the river to the
beginning. Containing 150 acres having one acre of land over built
and a saddle. I bequeath by the will of fifteen Dollars to make his right to the rest
of the heirs, and if any of the legatees is disentitled with this my last will
they are not to have any thing more than what they have already got from me
and I do hereby utterly disallow all and every other
