In obedience to an order of the County Court of Maryland made at the December
 term 1842. The undersigned Commissioners have proceeded to assist and set off
 the Dues of Elizabeth Hall widow of Saml. Hall deceased in the lands of which she and
 Saml. Hall did seized and after taking into consideration the quantity and
 quality of said lands according to value and kind, he leaves to state that they
 have assented and assigned to her Dues in lands as follows: Beginning at a point
 of Rock Creek above the mouth of the Spring branch and running between the pieces
 on the north side of the Creek to Saml. Robins line; and thence around with the
 line of the old Grants survey adjoining James Hall and Pleasant Austin
 and then to Rock Creek at or near Williams branch with Mills and down the course
 of the Creek to the beginning including the Missions house and all the intervening
 situated on said lands together with all the appurtenances, thence to begin
 running, We have also proceeded to assist Doves to the said Elizabeth Hall in the
 slaves of which she had owned Saml. Hall did possessed, and he leaves to state that
 the value of the slaves of said Saml. Hall deceased according to the appraisement
 amounted to the sum of \$4899.50. and we settled to her said Negro Boy
 named Jago appraised to \$800. and one Negro Girl named Peggy
 appraised to \$600. making in the whole at the above value the sum of \$1400.
 One third of all the slaves as well as provided would amount to the sum of
 \$1544.50. This having the amount allotted that we were able to make which
 would leave her looking in amount of \$165.50. of getting one third of the
 slaves according to the price then set upon the slaves by those who appraised
 the personal estate of the said Saml. Hall deceased. One of which is respectfully
 submitted. Please under our hands & seals this 27th day July 1843.
