

Stephen Perkins
Will.

I, Stephen Perkins of Orange County & State of Virginia do make and publish
this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and annulling all former
wills by me at any time heretofore made. I the said Stephen Perkins being
in my right mind & weak in body do first commend my soul to God
Christ & saint that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as
soon after my decease as possible out of the first monies that shall come
into the hands of my Executors from any portion of my estate real or
personal. The balance of estate I bequeath to my heirs as follows, the names
of which being surname, Isaac, Henry or his heirs, John R. Berry, Lucy or heirs
Rebecca, Linton & Stephen, I first & bequeath and give unto my son Isaac
One Cow, second I bequeath and give unto my son Isaac One B.D. and One
B.D. and one cow and all the land belonging to me lying on the West side
of Bluffy Creek including a tract which was taken up by me in the year 1820
of which he is to have the east end extending to the line between his land
my son Henry being deceased I bequeath and give unto his heirs as
follows, John Berry, One Dollar, Henry One Dollar, Mary Ann One Dollar
Lucy One Dollar, Rebecca M. One Dollar, Lucy One Dollar, I first & bequeath and
give unto my son John R. one fourth part in severalty of all the sheep
belonging to me. Fifth I bequeath and give unto my daughter Mary Ann
Berry's worth of property sixth I bequeath and give unto the heirs of my daughter
Lucy as follows, I first & bequeath and give unto my grand son Stephen Rufus
One Dollar, second I bequeath and give unto my grand son Philip Perkins
Rufus One Dollar, third I bequeath and give unto my grand son James
Perkins Rufus One Dollar, fourth I bequeath and give unto my daughter
Rebecca one fourth of my sheep in severalty, One Cow's worth, Twenty five Dollars
One Cow, One B.D. and One B.D. and all of the tract of land which
I bought of Jonathan Anderson lying south of Isaac Anderson's spring branch running
with an old line and back to a new line to an other branch. Fifth I
bequeath and give unto my son Stephen one half of all the rest of my land
lying east of Bluffy Creek known by being called my old tract, half of the tract
taken up by me in the year 1820 which shall be west of the line between the
tract One horse, One cow and One B.D. with twenty five Dollars, One Cow and one
B.D. and One B.D. and one fourth part of my sheep in severalty, Twenty five Dollars
in money, one half of my quarry and some tools & accoutrements of Hays
Ninth I bequeath and give unto my son Stephen one half of all the rest of my
land lying east of Bluffy Creek known by being called my old tract, half of the tract
taken up by me in the year 1820 which shall be west of the line between the
tract One horse saddle and Bridle with twenty five Dollars, One Cow and one
B.D. and One B.D. and one fourth part of my sheep in severalty, Twenty five Dollars
in money one half of my quarry and some tools and all of his own claim of Hays
After these divisions if there be any thing left I direct that it be equally
divided amongst John R. Berry, Rebecca, Linton, Stephen and the heirs of
Henry and Lucy. The said heirs of Henry to have an equal part with
one of my own heirs of this division, and the three heirs of Lucy to have

equal part with one of my own heirs of this last division or an equal part with the
said heirs of Henry. And I as hereby make and ordain my beloved son
Isaac and my beloved son in Law James Thomas Executors of this my last Will
and Testament. In Witness whereof I Stephen Perkins the testator have to this my
Will written on one sheet of paper set my hand and seal this the 20th day of
January in the year of our Lord 1824.
