The undersigned to wit some of the County Court of Grayson County at the November Term in term 1842 the undersigned Commissioners have proceeded to sell and try off the personal estate of the deceased Bledsoe and Stone in the lands of which the said Bledsoe and Stone decd owned and after taking into consideration the quantity and quality of said lands according to their nature and bounds, they have to state that they have assessed and appraised the same lands as follows: Beginning at a point of Rock Creek above the mouth of the Spring branch and running between the fields on the north side of the creek to Lewis Corners line; and thence around with the line of the old Spring survey adjoining James Hail and Bledsoe Burton and thence to Rock Creek at a new well near the mill and down the course of the creek to the beginning including the Missouri house and all the intervening situated on said land together with all the appurtenances thereunto appertaining. We have also proceeded to assess down to the said Bledsoe and Stone, in the slaves of which her husband Lewis Hail died possessed, and they have to state that the value of the slaves of said Lewis Hail decd according to the appraisement amounted to the sum of \$4899.50 and we started to have our Negro Boy assessed upon appraised to \$800 and one Negro Girl named Peggy appraised to \$600 making in the whole at the above value for sum of \$1549.50. This being the amount all toward that we were able to make which covered some back looking in amount of \$165.50 if getting one third of the slaves according to the price then set upon the slaves by the appraisement the personal estate of the said Lewis Hail decd.
