In the name of God Amen I Jacob Rudy of Grayson County and State of Virginia Being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto god calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the last day or general resurrection I Shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God And as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased god to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the manner and form following First I give and bequeath after my death to my dear wife Maryanna all my House hold and Kitchen furniture and her choice of the two Hares and two Cows & all my sheep and the ballance of my moveable property to be sold at publick sale and my just Debts paid out of the same and to hold and keep the title and possession of the plantation I now live on during her life Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Rudy the plantation which he now lives on he paying to his Brother George Rudy the sum of two hundred Dollars Fifty Dollars of the said sum in cash one hundred and fifty Dollars in trade The cash and trade part to be paid to the said George Rudy after my death at least in the space of three years after the same Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Stephen Rudy the plantation that I now live on he paying to his Brother David Rudy the sum of two hundred and twenty five Dollars one Hundred in cash the ballance in trade the said cash and trade to be paid to the said David Rudy three years after my death when the moveable property

House hold and Kitchen furniture is sold and my just Debts paid out of the same the ballance of the same to be paid to my Daughter Polly and the heirs of my Daughter Barbara Dead namely George Rudy and Peter Howell Barbary part to be Equally divided between the above named George and Peter and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull and Every other former Testaments Wills and Executors by me in any wise before named will and bequeath the said my and confirming this and know other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the twentyfirst day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventeen I do hereby constitute and appoint my Friends William Dail and Stephen Dail ser. to be my soul Executors of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and seal the day and year above Written
