 to there is no surplus paid to my other heirs for said Negroe Girl. I give and
 bequeath unto my son Aquilla Greer all and singular the plantation and lands
 belonging to it wheresoever I now live with every appurtenance thereof totally exclu-
 sive of my son Shadrach's share of my above mentioned Estate. And I hereby
 constitute make, and Ordain my son Shadrach Greer my sole Executor of this my
 last Will and testament, and I do hereby disallow revoke disannul all and
 every other former testaments Wills and Executors by me in anywise named and
 Willed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of February
 in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and two

In the name of God amen I Thomas Pyle of the County of Grayson and the State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say First I give to my wife Elizabeth Pyle all the movable property of my estate for and during her natural life term of her natural life and after her decease I give the same to my children herein after mentioned equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed by them forever and secondly I give to my son John Pyle one Dollar and Thirdly I give to my son Thomas Pyle one Dollar and 4thly I give unto my son Hercules Pyle one Dollar and 5thly I give unto my son William Pyle one Dollar and 6thly I give to my son James Pyle one Dollar and 7thly I give to my Daughter Sarah Lingen one Dollar and 8thly I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Jennings one Dollar and 9thly I give to my Daughter Hannah Robinson one Dollar which I give them their heirs executors and administrators and assigns forever and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Elizabeth Pyle and
