 or heretofore, for and during her natural life, or widow have then after
 her decease or second marriage, they shall and each of them be free men
 namely Dennis and Anthony for and during their lives thereafter
 And my will is further that my friends Grigg Hainton, and my son
 Spencer Rains and my son-in-law Jacob Tolson shall have the possession
 of them while they shall reside in this County, and if they shall wish to
 leave this County, and do leave it they shall leave the State of Virginia &
 the before named Grigg Hainton, Spencer Rains and Jacob Tolson shall then
 be discharged from any further oversight of them, And my will is
 further that what is above contained shall not interfere with my
 real and other personal Estate for the divisions of that I leave to
 the laws of my Country, in such cases made & provided to make
