Being very weak in body but of perfect mind memory thanks be given unto god calling unto mine the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men one to die do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that give it and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall recover the same again by the mighty power of god and as touching such worldly Estate where with it has pleased god to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form: I first I make and appoint my Son Samuel Cox & my Daughter Ann Cox to be my Executors and Executors of this my Last will and Testament all my Just Debts to be paid in the first place and my Estate to be divided followeth to my Daughter Ann Cox I give and bequeath a Negro boy named James also to my Daughter Catherine Blevins I give and bequeath a negro boy named Ben that she has now in her possession also to my Daughter Mary Phipps I give and bequeath a Negro girl named Sarah her natural life time and at her death the said negro girl and her increase if any to be left to her children Equal Divided also to my Daughter Margaret Duglafs I give and bequeath a Negro Girl named Agnes and not be exposed of in no manner by no person nor persons in

her natural lifetime then the said Negro girl and her increase to be Equally divided amongst her Children also to seven of my Sons that is to say Joshua John Samuel David Andrew Rankin and Alexander Coxes I give and bequeath my four negroes to wit Bett Alice Jacob and Pleasant to be set up and sold amongst our selves at the highest bidder and Alice and her Child Pleasant to be set up together and sold and the money to be Equally Divided amongst the above named sons also for my Negro man Rodge for my Son Samuel to take in his possession my negro man Roger and keep him at work for twelve years and then set him free and the said Samuel is to give him a piece of land his life time and to be a guardian for said negro to see that he behaves himself and to see that he won't be misused without a cause each of the legatees to receive one hundred Dollars and the said money to be paid yearly and to be paid agreeable age to say the oldest legatee first and so on till the twelve years is out if the said negro Roger dies or gets unable to work for the time he lives or is able to do good work for each year one hundred Dollars that is to be Equally divided amongst the whole of the legatees also my Son Richard Cox I give and bequeath to him my Wagon and kind gear also to my Son Rankin Cox I give and bequeath to him my Smith tools he is not to move them from the Shop till three years after my death also to my Son Alexander Cox I give and bequeath the Land above the crop fence and from the River as the fence runs to the top of the ridge then along the top of the Ridge to the head of the rich hollow then down the fence to his own line also if he lives to have any Lawful heirs then to have the hole of the Land I now live on also I bequeath and give to my grandson Haywood Cox a Son of Samuel Cox the Land that I now live on except my Son Alexander has a Lawful heirs also I give and bequeath unto my two granddaughters Malinda and Melinda Duglafs one black mare come of Jigon at my Death the said Land mare and her increase to be sold and the money part is Interest by my son Samuel till they come of age if one dies the other to have the whole also all Stock of all kinds not mentioned in this my Will and all Tools and all household goods of all sorts and every thing not mentioned to be discharged of at the highest bidder also my Still to be sold at the highest bidder also fifty acres of Land lying in North Carolina Rankin Cox Land and Samuel Coxes the Land fifty acres to be ~~divided~~ divided Equally between Rankin Cox and Haywood Cox a Negro man Cox also to my Daughter Ann Cox I give and bequeath one hundred

In pursuance of an order of Grayson Court made at February Term 1824 directing us to examine State and settle the accounts of Samuel Cox acting Executor of Daniel Cox Esq. We have proceeded on the 16th day of September 1825 at the Clerk's Office of Grayson after being sworn to perform that duty and begin leave to make the following Report. It appears that the Executor after distributing the legacies mentioned in the Will was then in possession of property debts and money contained in a list which has been returned into the Clerk's Office and Recorded, amounting to the sum of \$2983.62 & cents the principal of which was property sold a part thereof on the 29th day of June 1819 and the Residue on the 22nd November 1819 and 22nd January 1820 the whole of the purchase money become due on the 29th day of June 1820 and since the return of the list of Sales by the Executors our report there has come into his hands accounts to the amount of \$175.53 cents which sum added to the amount of above Will amount to the sum of \$3159.15 cents and it appears from the vouchers that the said Executor has paid out \$135.98 & cents and a note on Daniel Burford of \$18.09 not collected which added to the above vouchers filed makes \$154.07 & cents which sum taken from the above will still leaves a sum in the Executors hands of \$3004.12

Your Commissioners find that nothing more than the above bond and Thomas Widdett & Henry Huggins came to the hands of the Committee eighty dollars of which was paid to Mr Widdett on the 13th day of October 1833 for keeping & clothing the said Eli Widdett during 2 years. Your Commissioners then to the allowance made for the said Eli Widdett for his trouble too little but was induced to enter it at 40.00 at his own request. Whether the allowance to Mr Widdett for finding, clothing & taking care of the said Eli is too much or to little your Commissioners does not undertake to determine but he is informed that two respectable freeholders of the County thought proper to allow him 40.00 per year. From the statements now made and herewith exhibited your Commissioners find that only the sum of 193.76 now remains of Eli Widdett's distributed share of his father's personal estate which is not sufficient to pay the amount now due to Mr Widdett for keeping the said Eli by about the sum of 120.24
Your Commissioners also beg leave to say that the whole of the above balance of 193.76 has been paid over by Mr Nuckolls to Mr Widdett so that nothing now remains in his or one of Eli's Committee.

Kingson County — That in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty seven and the thirty day of November I Stephen Clark of the state and county above mentioned have through the mercy of God and his kind providence has preserved me to the present date in a sound mind though weak in body but thanks be to his name for his peculiar care that has kept my memory in full vigor so that I am able to make out the substance of what is reflecting on a future day and therefore I have this day above named resolved to make my last Will and testament and not to be revoked by the displeasure of my lawful wife Sally Clark now living nor by the death of her body who and my heirs that neither of them shall have the power to revoke this my last Will and testament but that it shall remain at my option during my natural life and that after my decease if there should be found any contradiction in this my last Will and testament I shall not be considered that the first shall be taken of this my last Will and the latter part of the said Will to be rejected but that the last shall be taken as the first and the first as the latter and in any other part or parts of this my last Will and testament — and therefore I Stephen Clark do bequeath and give to my oldest son John H. Clark thirty dollars and to my son oldest son Jeffrey Clark I give and bequeath in this my last will the sum of thirty dollars and this is the amount that each of them of the two sons shall have and no more and that my son Jeffrey the son to the oldest shall be paid by the third oldest son of mine Andrew Clark the amount of thirty dollars and to my first named son John H. Clark shall be paid by my youngest son named Oliver Clark the amount of thirty dollars and no more and as the land on which I am now living which I have bought and paid for the sum I have in possession in fee simple or forever to me and my heirs and assigns but as the times are open and uncertain I cannot tell the number of acres and that in case I should decease before the said land is surveyed each of my two youngest sons shall have an equal part to get the lines about the expense of which shall be born in an equal share for if it was surveyed it should be my will that the two youngest sons named the first of mine Jeffrey Clark & the second Oliver Clark each should have an equal share or part of the said land on which I now live but as it is uncertain that the foregoing failure of the now surveying is not intended as a condition but in the fulfillment of my last Will and testament so that if it is surveyed or not it shall be taken by the meaning of my will viz. that I Stephen Clark do give and bequeath to my two youngest sons the first named Andrew Clark and the second named Oliver Clark and that the land by the tract which I bought of Daniel Fadden together with the tract which I bought of Ben Hurnd
