296 and heres Last furniture shall be left and bequeath unto my Loving wife Sarah Hutton her lifetime all my Estate Real & personal I leave unto her so long as she lives and after her death Equally to be divided among my children namely sons Joshua Hutton Lapse Hutton Olisha Hutton Newman Hutton Pleasant Hutton Alexander Hutton Daughters Mary Hutton Beady Hutton Sarah Hutton Nancy Hutton Charity Hutton and the above named Joshua and Lapse Hutton has received forty Dollars each of them which is part of those legises in said Estate and I direct my Estate not be praisse and further I do ordain my trusty friends Charles Mabery and Arvin Montgomery and John Cook Executors of this my last will and testament and lastly my Expiys will and meaning is and I do hereby order and appoint that if any difference dispute question or controversy shall be moved arise or happen concerning any gift bequest matter or thing in this my will given and bequeathed or Exposed or contained that then no suit or suits in law or Equity or other wise shall be brought commenced or prosecuted for and concerning the same but the same shall be referred wholly to the award order and determination of my friends Charles Mabery Arvin Montgomery & John Cook of Grayson County and State of Virginia and what they shall order direct or determine therein shall be binding and conclusive to all and every person and persons therein concerned signed sealed in the presents of this fourteenth day of September 1824
