I Daniel Coley of Grayson County and State of Virginia now being in a low state of health but sound in mind do hereby make my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following

First I devise all my Just Ditts to be paid Secondly I leave to my wife Elizabeth Coley one third part of my Estate during the time of her widowhood which property after her decease or disposal to any other person shall be equally divided between my two Children Tucker Coley and Sally Coley to be enjoyed them and their heirs forever. I desire that my horse and Gigg may be sold upon twelve months Credit the money arising therefrom to be appropriated for the support of my wife and children or as my two friends George Currier James Anderson who I appoint my Executors shall hereafter think proper. My house & Lotts in this County I desire that my wife may have peaceable possession of during her widowhood unless it is thought best by

himself and my Executors to sell them. If they are sold I wish two thirds of the money arising therefrom to be appropriated towards educating and raising my above mentioned children and to be disposed of as my Executors may think proper and I wish it further to be understood that my desire is that provided my wife shall not think proper to live in or occupy said houses by the consent of herself and my Executors they may at anytime be rented the rent to be appropriated towards the support my wife and the education and support of my children in towards repairing said house as they my Executors may think best. I do hereby acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament Revoking all Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty eighth Elizabeth Coley
