In Obedience to an order of Grayson Court made at March 1823 report directing us to examine State and Settle the accounts of James Anderson Esq. Executor of Daniel Cooley Deed we have proceeded on the 28th day of May 1823 at Grayson Clerks Office to perform that duty James Anderson Esq. of Dr Cooley Deed and one of the administrators of George Curran Deed & one of the Joshua Stoneman also one of the administrators of the said George Curran Deed who was the other Executor of Daniel Cooley Deed being present and beg leave to make the following report It appears that there came to the hands of the Executors of Daniel Cooley Deed personal property which was sold on the 6th day of June 1812 on twelve months credit for the amount of \$ 473.53 cents. That there came to their hands about the same time \$ 50. a debt due from Martin Dickenson and since that period there has come to their hands for cents of debts \$ 129. at different periods.

The account will stand thus.

Amount of Sales	\$ 473.53
Debt from Dickenson	50
For Rents	129
Amount of debts	\$ 352.53

It appears that the said Executors have paid out and expended the sum of \$ 255.04 vouchers for which have been produced a list of which is hereto annexed and which we wish to be considered part of this Report which being deducted from the amount of debts leaves in their hands the sum of \$ 97.49. In pertaining from which of the Executors this sum is due we find that there is due from James Anderson \$ 34.09 and from Curins Administrators \$ 63.40 and that they have not received any compensation for settling the Estate. We would further remark that the Rents than those contained in the account have been received by the Executors but which have been paid in Repairs which were necessary to be made on the lots and have been omitted as unnecessary in this report.

278 I John Scuders of Grayson County and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and testament manner and form following that is to say first I give my wife Nancy Scuders a certain tract a parcel of Land lying on in the County of Grayson containing 130 acres more or less lying on Pauls Creek bearing the land of Labus Johnson and Levy Aston and others during the term of her natural life and after her decease I give the same to my two Daughters Polly and Phoebe to be equally divided between them and to be enjoyed by them forever. 2d I give to my Daughter by the name one Dollar to be paid at the Death of my wife 3dly I give to my Daughter Nancy Carter one Dollar to be paid to her at the Death of my wife and lastly do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Nancy Scuders and William Combs executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th day of March 1817
