In the name of God amen I Peter Coleman senior of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia being very weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling to mind the mutability of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say. First I give and recommend my soul into the hands of All Mighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors And as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, devise and dispose of in the manner and form following. First I give and bequeath unto my Wife Abigail all my land and my Mills to be by her enjoyed while she remains my Widow and after her marriage or decease. It is my Will that the same be freely and fairly enjoyed by my son Stephen Coleman. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son William Coleman Five pounds which he is owing me by note of hand. Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my sons Abraham Coleman, Peter Coleman, Richard Coleman, Daniel Coleman each of them twentyfive cents to be paid unto them immediately after my decease. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Williams 25 cents to be paid as before. Fifthly I give unto my Daughter Rachel Burcham the sum of ten Dollars to be paid to her immediately after my decease by my executors. Sixthly I give unto my daughter Sarah Wells twentyfive cents to be paid to her as before. Seventhly as to my daughter Charity it is my desire that all my Movable property after the above named legacies is paid up be put into the hands of my executors for her maintenance and if there should be any of said property left after her decease it is my desire that it be equally divided between my sons Abraham Coleman and Stephen and my daughters Rachel and Sarah. And I do hereby Ordain and Appoint my sons Abraham and Stephen to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby make Null and void all former Wills and bequests ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I

That is to say first I assue that immediately after my decease that there be as much of my personal estate sold as ^{will pay} all my Just Debts and funeral expences secondly I give the remainder of all my personal estate to my two daughters Mary and Eliza to be equally divided between them. Thirdly my Will is that my son James be acquitted of all the debts here on him for the land I conveyed to him on his paying my son Reuben Bedwell seven pounds ten shillings fourthly my will is that my son Elisha have the remainder of the plantation including the mansion house on his paying my sons Robert John & Thomas each Five pounds ^{good} in hand or on his refusing to comply with the above Requisition the Lands to be sold and equally divided between Elisha Robert John and Thomas. Report directing us to examine State and settle the accounts of James Anderson
Executor of Daniel Cooley Decd. we have proceeded on the 28th day of May
1823 at Grayson Clerk's Office to perform that duty James Anderson
of D. Cooley Decd. and one of the administrators of George Currin Decd. &
one of the Joshua Stoneman also one of the administrators of the said
George Currin Decd. who was the other Executor of Daniel Cooley Decd.
being present and beg leave to make the following report. It ap-
pears that there came to the hands of the Executors of Daniel Cooley Decd.
personal property which was sold on the 6th day of June 1812 on twelve
months credit for the amount of \$1,73.53 cents. That there came to
their hands about the same time \$50. a debt due from Martin
Dickenson and since that period there has come to their hands for
rents of Lots h. & 129 at several periods.

It appears that the said Executors have paid out and expended the sum
of \$250.04 vouchers for which have been produced a list of which is hereto
annexed and which we wish to be considered part of this Report which
being deducted from the amount of assets leaves in their hands the
sum of \$99.49. An amounting from which of the Executors this sum
is due. We find that there is due from James Anderson \$34.09 and
from Currin Administrators \$63.40 and that they have not received any
compensation for settling the Estate. We would further remark that other
Rents than those contained in the account have been received by the
Executors but which have been paid in repairs which were necessary to
be made on the lots and have been omitted as unnecessary in this report.
