One Cow and calf & twenty head of hogs for and during her natural the term of her Natural life and secondly after her decease all my land East and West of the above mentioned branch to descend and belong to my Grandson Robert Keith and his heirs forever with this proviso that his father my son Gingo Keith live to have full possession of all that part of my land lying East of the above mentioned branch and to be enjoyed by him for and during the term of his natural life Thirdly I do give unto my son Daniel Keith one Dollar and to each of my Daughters Polly Pater Susanna Pater Prudence Pater the sum of One Dollar each And lastly I do constitute and appoint my trusty friends Abner Jones and John Fletcher Executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelveth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & three signed sealed & acknowledged in presence

In the name of God amen I James Parks of Grayson County and State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I therefore give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say First I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Hannah the third part of all I possess during her natural life and widowhood and after her life or widowhood to be divided equally to the children here mentioned. Secondly Elizabeth my daughter hath already got sufficient till her mothers death. Thirdly I give to my several children that is to say to James my son John my son Andrew my son an equal part of the remainder ^{part} of my land after paying all lawful debts as the said children shall arrive at their full age and not before and my son James John Andrew shall have as much as my daughter Elizabeth has had and then the rest to be equally divided among the four children. And if it should please god to call any one of the said three boys I will that that part should be divided among the other two and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving wife Hannah and my friends Jonathan Thomas
