First I will that all my just debts be paid, also I will that Roddy Beames my beloved wife do have the plantation with the appurtenances along therewith that I now live on for her support her life time also my share of horses cattle & pigs & sheep & with my waggon & farming tools house hold kitchen furniture, and at her death all the personal Estate if any to be equally divided among all my children, Only I will my Daughter Charaes Beames & Nancy Beames & Nancy Beames now if each or either do marry have as the other Daughters viz One Cow & One hea & furniture each & two sheep each — Also that my home land of land be for my youngest son Prossah Beames at the death of my wife Roddy and if she comes of age to be his own agent before her mother's death that he have privilege to work on any part of said tract of land so as not to be any detriment to her support in her life time. I also will all my other lands to be equally divided between my other four sons to wit, Peter Beames Henry Beames Isaac Beames & Richard Beames so that those that have made improvements obtain their improvements they have made. I do by this present certify ratify & confirm my said last will and testament and do further give & bequeath unto my loving grandson Philip Edwards an Equal share divide with all my own children in all my personal estate at the death of my wife Roddy I also constitute ordain my son Peter Beames the sole Executor of this my last will and testament. choice of all the farming tools also all the household & kitchen furniture

also the ox waggon the saw mill and tub mill cooking chest and cooking cloth, for
and during the term of her widowhood or natural life and after her decease, I give
the same to my daughter Nancy Coaltrane with the exception that my daughter
Rachel Coaltrane is to have her support out of the above named estate and that Nancy
is to have the care of Rachel and that Nancy Coaltrane's three sons named Jm
Coaltrane John Coaltrane and Clark Coaltrane and when the above named
sons as they come of age they shall have equal portion with Nancy in the above
named Estate real and personal and at Nancy Coaltrane's decease the whole of the
above named Estate shall belong to her three sons above named and if any of
the above named sons shall die without an heir the estate shall belong to the
surviving ones above named, and Nancy Coaltrane is to have one cow at my
decease over and above the five cows that is mentioned above, also the said
pair of bellies and new pipe to belong to my wife and family herebefore
mentioned, I also leave my wife and the family herebefore mentioned all the grain
that is on the place and as much meat as will be sufficient to support them one
year, also my wheat fan cutting knife and box to belong to them herebefore mention-
ed, Secondly the 1/2 of tract of land and the piece of tract of land I give to
my three daughters named Hannah White purnia Elder and Martha Elder, the
same to be divided equally among the three and Hannah White is to have that
part where she now lives, Thirdly I give to my daughter Mary Bodin the tract of
land lying on the good spier road that I purchased from Edwards to belong to her
and her heirs, by her or her heirs paying twenty five dollars, fourthly I desire that
the garden mill and all that is belonging to it together with all the rest of my estate
not herebefore named shall be immediately sold after my decease and out of
the monies arising therefrom all my just debts be paid, and the residue thereof
to be as follows that is to say I give fifteen Dollars to be equally divided among
the heirs of my son William Coaltrane, I give to the heirs of my daughter Emily
Coaltrane that is to say, twenty five Dollars to Nancy Coaltrane, five Dollars
to Hannah Swett, ten Dollars to Phineas Coaltrane, and ten Dollars to Mahaley
Coaltrane. I also give twenty five Dollars to Alexander Coaltrane, all the
rest of my estate both real and personal, of what nature or kind soever it
may be, not herein before particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divid-
ed among my five daughters Mary Bodin purnia Elder, Martha Elder
Hannah White and Nancy Coaltrane, which I give to them their heirs Executors
Administrators and assigns forever and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
my friend Jonathan Cook Executor of this my last will and testament hereby
