That I give to my dear and loving wife Mary Frost the land and tenement whereon I now live together with the house and furniture and as much of the stock of horses, cattle, hogs and sheep as she can so part and keep up during her natural life and widow hood and after her death I will and order that of the three youngest Children a not grown to maturity that they should have several and the two boys for a and I intend have learning out of my Estate I will and order that my son Ed. Fred that he have and lawfully hold the tract of land containing one hundred acres more or less whereon he now lives and then as to his part of my Estate together with what he has already received - And I will that James Frost and John Frost and Simon Frost my three youngest sons have all my lands and my waggon and quid I will and order that my daughter Sally Frost do have fifty dollars worth of property and I will order that my daughter Rebecca Frost have fifty dollars worth of property to make their portions equal with those of my daughters that is named Mary and John and I will order that my son John Frost do have fifty dollars worth of property, after this is done I will order that my Estate be sold on credit of twelve months and I will and order that the said Fred have two dollars out of my Estate. The Balance of my Estate be equally divided between my son Stephen Frost my daughter Mary Frost and my daughter Rebecca Frost and my daughter John Frost and my daughter Simon Frost and my daughter James Frost have the balance of my Estate equally divided amongst them. I do constitute William Lawrence son and loved all those my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of April in the year of our Lord 1838.

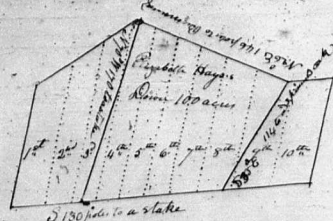

This Inventory & Appraisement of the Personal Estate of Jacob Hays dec'd was produced in Court and ordered to be recorded.

In obedience to an order of the County Court of Grayson directed (Commissioners) for that purpose assigned to Elizabeth Hays the widow of Jacob Hays dec'd her share in the slave belonging to the Estate of her deceased husband and that we do lay off and assign to the said widow by meter and bounds her share in the land of which her husband died seized and it is further ordered that the undersigned after they shall have allotted the widow her share in the slave proceed to see the remainder thereof and it is further ordered that partition of the land of the said Jacob Hays dec'd after allotting the widow her share be made between the heirs at law.

We the undersigned lay have to make the following report: We have proceeded to lay off the widow her share in the slave belonging to the estate and deceased as follows to wit: A Negro woman named Nancy and a negro girl named Ann. We have laid off the widow her share in the land belonging to the Estate of said deceased as follows to wit: Beginning at the corner and thence to the beginning corner of Jacob Hays' 200 acre Survey and running N 70° W 70 poles to a stake thence in the West line of said survey thence with said line South 80 poles to a stake thence thence running and line N 35° E 14 poles to a stake thence thence N 65° E 46 poles to the beginning and more fully as appeared by the plat hereto annexed. We have after allotting the widow her share in the slave belonging to the estate of said deceased proceeded to see the remainder thereof to wit: A Negro boy named Isaac for the sum of four hundred and forty dollars, and a negro boy named John for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars after advertising the sale of said slaves for two days of four weeks and having taken bond and good security for the same on a credit of six months. We have after allotting the widow her share in the land proceeded to partition the land belonging to the Estate of said deceased between the heirs at law as follows to wit: Lot N° 1 - 20 acres, Randal's Co. Lot N° 2 - 20 acres, William Hays. Lot N° 3 - 20 acres, Emily Hays. Lot N° 4 - 20 acres, John Hays. Lot N° 5 - 20 acres, William Pollard. Lot N° 6 - 20 acres, Benjamin Pollard. Lot N° 7 - 20 acres, Samuel Pollard. Lot N° 8 - 20 acres, Nathan Pollard. Lot N° 9 - 20 acres, Elizabeth Hays. Lot N° 10 - 20 acres, John Pollard, John Ramsey and Andrew Ramsey all of which will be sold fully as appeared on the plat by the said lines. We were informed that there was fifty acres of land belonging to the Estate of said deceased which had been entered and surveyed but the title paper was lost or misplaced consequently we could do nothing with it. All of which is respectfully submitted.

I also give to Phoebe B. Roberts the sum of One hundred and seven dollars including the above named sum of fifty dollars which Fildes B. Roberts & Jeremiah Roberts is to pay as first a bond mentioned out of the price of the land, also One Cow with calf, One good Bed and furniture. I do also give unto my youngest daughter Eliza Ann Roberts the sum of 57 Dollars, One Cow & calf, One Bed worth twenty dollars together with fifty dollars which my sons Fildes B. Roberts & Jeremiah Roberts is to pay as first a bond mentioned out of the price of the land and after paying to each legatee the above named sum, severally out of the remaining part of my personalty properly after paying my just debts & funeral expenses, I desire that the remainder should be well & legally divided amongst my five daughters, Viz. Festina Roberts, Sally Porter, Elizabeth Husk to be B. Roberts & Eliza Ann Roberts.
