J. Renny Will Whereas I John Renny of Grayson County and State of Virginia, do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form following, viz; I give unto my son William Renny all that Tract of Land that he now lives on, Beginning at Parkers Line, thence down the Creek to a pine tree, from thence down the Creek round the improvements to the out side line and all the Remaining part of my Land is to be divided between my four Daughters in the manner following, viz; I give unto Elizabeth all the bottom Land the East side of Crooked Creek joining the said Creek with a sufficient Quantity of timber on the whole Tract above mentioned, and if it should so happen that Elizabeth should decease & have no heir it is my Will that John Renny Son of William Renny should be heir to all the part of the aforesaid Land also I give unto my Daughter Margaret all the bottom Land lying the West side of the said Creek unto Clara's Branch and Crooked Creek is the line between each part also after my Wifes Decease I give unto my aforesaid two Daughters my house and furniture to be equally divided between them, and likewise all my Stock to be divided in like manner, excepting one cow which I give to my grand Daughter Eleanor Smith also I give unto my above named two Daughters all my farming utensils to be equally divided between them also I give unto the above mentioned, John Renny my best wearing apparel, and the ballance to them that is ready, also the other two Lots I give to my other two Daughters Jane Ballard and Eleanor Dick to Dispose of at their pleasure, also my Will is to be free to all the Heirs living on the above mentioned Tract of Land, and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Eleanor Renny and William Renny Executors to this my last will and Testament this 23^d day of April 1821
