In the name of God amen I Jacob Rector of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory write for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with. I give and bequeath the same in the manner following that is to say; first, I assign that all my Just debts be paid out of the perishable part of my estate and immediate sale to be made of it after my decease and all my household affairs and the monies arising therefrom I bequeath to my wife Mary Rector as a maintenance and for to be at her disposal except such part as shall hereafter be disposed of. Secondly, to the children of Nancy Williams I give ten shillings each. Thirdly, I give to my son Peter Rector one Negro woman named Hannah and fourthly, I leave to my son James Rector one Negro child named Lander and fifteen Dollars. and fifthly I give unto my son Jesse Rector one Negro girl named Mild at my wife's decease. and sixthly I give to my son Binnet Rector one Negro girl named Anne. and seventhly, I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Hays one Negro girl named Bet which I give to them their heirs Executors, Administrators and assigns forever and ever. and lastly I do constitute and appoint my friends Jesse Rector and Jacob Hays Executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and former Wills or testaments by me heretofore made.
