This Appraisement was returned to the Office and admitted to Record. Test M. Dickenson C. C.

I James M'Clure of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia being weak in body but sound in mind, reason and memory do make this my last will and testament this twenty seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixteen which is as follows. First that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha M'Clure this plantation whereon we now live containing Eighty acres. Also one half of the perishable property and all the household furniture and all the money and notes due for her own proper use during her lifetime this is my wish and desire. The house hold furniture to be at her own disposal at her decease. Thirdly

I do give my son Samuel M'Clure a certain small horse which he borrowed from me when he moved to the State of Ohio also a note that I have against him to the amount of Eight Dollars the above mentioned Samuel M'Clure is to pay out of this unto my Daughter Mary Talbot's children twenty Dollars the twenty Dollars to be Equally divided amongst them. Fourthly I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Hill and my son William M'Clure the Cranberry tract of land containing Eighty acres to be Equally divided between them. Fifthly I do more over give unto my above mentioned son William M'Clure the other half of the above mentioned perishable property and also at the decease of my beloved wife Martha M'Clure the said plantation where we now live to have for his own proper use also the Remainder of my Estate if any at her death this is my wish and desire for it to be Lastly I do constitute and appoint My beloved wife Martha M'Clure and my son William M'Clure Executors to this my will the day and year above written.
