Testament in manner and form following that is to say

Will 1st I desire that all the perishable part of my Estate be immediately sold
after my decease and out of the monies arising therefrom all my
just debts and funeral expenses be paid Should the perishable part
of my property prove insufficient for the above purposes then I desire
that my Executors have after named may sell my house and lands
lying in the said County of Grayson and out of the monies arising
therefrom pay and satisfy such of my just debts as shall remain
unpaid out of the sales of the perishable part of my Estate after
the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses I desire

I bequeath unto my Eldest son Samuel one Dollar and no more
 2^d I give and bequeath unto my second son James the sum of one
 hundred Dollars 3^d I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary one
 Dollar and no more 4th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Louis
 the sum of one Dollar and no more 5th I give and bequeath unto my
 Daughter Margaret the sum of fifty Dollars. 6th I give and bequeath
 unto my son Sampson the sum of thirty Dollars. 7th I give and be-
 queath unto my Daughter Esther the sum of Fifty Dollars. 8th I
 give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann the sum of Fifty Dollars
 9th I give and bequeath unto my son Charles the sum of one Dollar
 and no more 10th I give and bequeath unto my youngest daughter
 Elizabeth the sum of Fifty Dollars. 11th I give and bequeath unto
 my Grand son Martin the sum of one hundred Dollars to be paid
 in property valued by cash at his arrival at the age of twenty one
 years 12th Lastly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife and my
 son William after paying all my Just debts and funeral expences
 all the residue and remainder of my property and lands for them
 to have and to hold during their natural life and after the nat-
 ural death of my beloved wife I will and bequeath all the real
 and personal property that they both hold at her death to my son
 William for him to have and to hold forever lastly I do hereby con-
 stitute and appoint my trusty friends Louis my wife and William
 my son Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking
