that, is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last
Will and testament that is to say principally, and first of all I give and
recommennd my soul unto the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my
body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the
discretion of my executor, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the Mighty power of God and touching
such worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and
form first my desire is that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be
paid, Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary for
maintenance as long as she lives, Thirdly I give unto my beloved son
George One cent. Fourthly I give unto my beloved son William One cent.
Fifthly I give unto my beloved son Jonathan one cent. Sixthly I give unto
my beloved son Jesse one cent, Seventhly I give unto my beloved son
Joseph One cent. Eighthly I give unto my beloved son Daughten Henry
One cent. Ninthly I give my beloved Daughter Mary One yearling
Cow forste, Tenthly I give unto my beloved Daughter Elizabeth the
Remainder of all my estate Real and Personal Lands and tenements
fully forever by her and her heirs to be possessed, I like wife constitute
and appoint and ordain Stephen Papp the sole Executor of this my last
Will and testament all and singular my lands and messuages and
tenements by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed by him, and I do hereby
attestly disavow and revoke and disannule all and every other former testa-
ment, Wills Legacies bequath and Executors by me in any wise and
confirming this and no other to be my last Will and testament In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of
